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Why vote?

You decide! Why your vote matters

Legitimation

The active members of your student council and the members of the students' parliament represent your interests towards the university, professors or even representatives of the state government. They are legitimised by law to do so, but their voice has a greater impact if more students show their support by voting at the students' election. The Students' representatives for many committees in the KIT are elected by the students' parliament. Here they discuss with professors and scientific staff about, among other things, changes in study and examination regulations, distribution of quality assurance funds or the orientation of courses offered by HoC and ZAK. They advocate for equal opportunities at the KIT and for the improvement of services for students with disabilities. Because the number of students' representatives is mostly quite small, it is more important to strengthen their position with your vote. Furthermore, the students' parliament elects the General Students Committee (Allgemeiner Studierendenausschuss or AStA in german). The AStA works closely with the KIT and the Studierendenwerk and try to improve the studying conditions, for example for students with children. The AStA helps students with financial problems. It also supports students' involvement by helping, for example, university groups finding rooms or supporting them financially.

You can also support their work by voting at the students' election! Even if you haven't come in touch with the students' parliament or the AStA yet, you probably went to your student council (Fachschaft) from time to time, which is also part of the student body. It's where you can buy past exams or get answers to questions about your field of study. All active members of your student council are volunteers. You can show your support for their work by voting at the elections for the student council board members.

What do you get?

You may ask yourself if all those people do this only to improve their own CV, or if it improves your life, too. Basically, the students' representatives work constantly to improve the conditions of your studies. Maybe you switched from one examination regulation to another because a less important course was replaced with a more useful one? These changes are not only agreed upon with your representatives, they often are the ones who initiate them.

One tool for this is, for example, ballots, with the help of which you can decide on current issues in a grassroots democratic manner. Currently, two ballots have been announced. One is a vote on an offer with NextBike, which gives all students access to a special

rate. Secondly, you can vote on joining the fzs (Freier Zusammenschluss von Student*innenschaften e.V.). You can find more information about this below.

Maybe you've got a project that you want to realise with other students? The best idea is to start a university group! We currently have over 100 university groups that are involved in a big range of topics, from environmental protection to motorsports. To keep all these possibilities for students to get involved, the student body has to negotiate rooms and assistance with the KIT again and again. If you want to support these possibilities, you can show that by voting at the elections.


Fees

You may have already realised that every semester, when you do your renewal, you pay a small fee to the student body. This money is used to fund all the services that it provides. For example, the fees are used to provide extensive advisory service, such as the legal advice and social counselling. They are also used to support university groups financially. Another part of the fees is given to your student council, so that they can pay for their office supplies and other work material, fund their infrastructure and go to conferences to connect with students from other universities about their work. Do you think you you are paying too much every semester? Or do you think that the student body should have even more money for their projects? It is your chance to decide! The student parliament

The student parliament (StuPa) is the decision-making body of the constituted student body (VS). It consists of 25 members who belong to different political lists. Your votes decide who may enter the StuPa and thus how many votes are available to the respective lists.

You wonder what the StuPa is for?

The StuPa's tasks include electing the AStA's officers, amending the statutes, deciding on the student body's budget, and appointing members to official university-wide committees. Above all, however, it represents the opinion of the entire VS on certain topics and therefore profits significantly from each individual vote, which legitimizes it in its function as a representative, e.g. vis-à-vis the KIT.

You'd rather take a closer look?

The student parliament meets publicly - which means that you are also welcome as a guest at any time! If you want to secure a permanent place in the Stu-Pa, there are numerous lists and associated university groups at KIT, in which your opinions will certainly be heard. With a bit of luck, you will be elected to the StuPa. If no list meets your requirements, you are of course invited to found your own.

You have an important concern or an idea for an improvement in the VS?

Basically, any student can submit a motion to the StuPa with the help of 24 supporters. You can find examples of past resolutions online at https://www.asta-kit.de/en/studierendenschaft/stupa/beschlusssammlung. You can check whether your motion was successful and what was discussed in general in the StuPa at any time online in the minutes at https://www.asta-kit.de/en/studierendenschaft/stupa/protokolle.

The student council

The student council - a cooperative, supportive and fun-planning body between the students and the institutions of study cannot stand on two feet - let alone walk - without an elected student council!

The student council board of a student council takes on all kinds of organisational obligations, seeks contact and links to other areas and instances on the KIT campus and is instrumental in voting and implementing changes within the student council as well as in planned events for the students.

In the coming elections, it is your task to give the student council a face that represents you, your wishes and your needs and also responsibly puts them into practice.

Ballots

Ballots are important decisions that are made directly by the student body. A ballot can be called by the student parliament, the student council conference, or by the signatures of 5% of the students and must be reviewed by the council of elders (ÄRa).

This year, the following two issues will be decided by ballot:

1. Ballot on CAMPUSbike

Currently, a test phase for CAMPUSbike is running until the end of September. Now there is the possibility to extend the offer until September 2024.

The ballot decides on the conclusion of such a contract.

Conditions

- The bike can be used free of charge for 30min per trip. There must be at least 15min between two rides.
- If the 30min are exceeded, 0,50 € will be charged for each additional 30min or part thereof. The maximum charge per day is 5,00 €
- At this rate 2 bikes can be rented at the same time. If more than 2 bikes are rented, the regular rate of nextbike must be paid (currently 1 € per 30min and a maximum of 9 € per day).
- The tariff is valid throughout Germany (except Usedom, Bremen, Kiel, Munich and Nuremberg).
- Use of e-bikes and cargo bikes included.

Costs

The costs are $2,25 \in$ per semester per student. These costs are borne by the Verfasste Studierendenschaft, it will be necessary to increase the student body fee (currently \notin 3.50).

Further information

The number of bikes in Karlsruhe will almost double from 340 to 650 as of August. As of the end of May, 3,516 KIT students were registered with Nextbike - that is about 16% of KIT students. In the month of May, 18,056 rentals took place. Of these, well over 90% were under 30min and thus free of charge.

Consequences of the approval

If the ballot is in favor of concluding the contract, the special conditions CAM-PUSbike will be valid until September 2024. A contribution increase will be necessary to finance this.

Consequences of rejection

If the ballot is against the conclusion of a contract, the special conditions will only be available until September 2021 and will then expire.

2. Ballot on fzs

Note from the editors:

The discussion about the ballot on joining the fzs set off a highly polarizing debate in the student parliament. There seem to be extremely controversial opinions on this. In order to do justice to both sides, we decided to have the respective side write a text on the pros and cons.

Accordingly, these texts tend to represent opinions and therefore do not necessarily claim to present the facts in a factual and sober manner.

The following are these texts.

PROS

The fzs (federation of student unions) is currently the only general, party-independent, nationwide student association in Germany. It represents students at the federal level and ensures that student needs are taken into account in federal politics. Its members comprise about one third of the students in Germany. This makes the fzs the largest student association in Germany.

The political orientation and topics of the association are determined at the twice-yearly general meetings. Here it is clear that the fzs, as a democratic interest group, takes majority decisions that do not always correspond to the individual opinions of all students. Basically, it can be said that the resolutions, demands and positions of the fzs in recent years have had a strong student connection and would bring better study conditions and financial relief to the majority of all students in Germany. The fzs fights against tuition fees, for a better BAföG, sufficient equipment and financing of universities, good study conditions and teaching & learning quality, a good social situation of students, better perspectives for students in the corona pandemic and much more.

Only as a full member can the KIT student body again have a stronger say in the positions and the issues of the fzs, which is now already often perceived (e.g. in the media) as the official voice of German students.

In the recent past, the fzs has had several successes, among others, with the Action Alliance against Tuition Fees, which it leads. The Action Alliance has been campaigning for the nationwide abolition of tuition fees for years. For example, the general tuition fees in Baden-Württemberg of 1000,00€ per year (500,00€ per semester) were abolished in 2012 also due to this pressure. Likewise, the Action Alliance against tuition fees for international students is currently taking legal action in Baden-Württemberg.

For the representation of student interests, the fzs is in regular contact with the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF), the German Student Union (umbrella organization of the individual student unions) and other actors. Again and again, the fzs is also asked by courts and parliaments to comment on legislative or court proceedings. For example, in recent years in the Bundestag on the topic of BAföG, rents or the minimum wage law, the state parliament of Baden-Württemberg and the Federal Constitutional Court. Furthermore, the fzs does value

able lobbying work with federal politicians*, draws attention to the needs of students in the media and organizes political campaigns. In addition, the fzs has a higher education policy education program that is open to all students.

The fzs also represents German students at the European level in the Bologna process and in the European student umbrella organization ESU.

By joining, the KIT student body would support this work and thus advocate for student needs nationwide and throughout Europe. Although education is first and foremost a state matter, the federal government has a great influence on universities and students throughout Germany via federal-state agreements, financial programs, and the co-design of European higher education policy, and also determines BAföG policy. For a strong student voice, a powerful nationwide student association is needed: the fzs. In addition, the student body would gain access to extended educational offers, discounts on educational offers, access to the infrastructure of the fzs and to framework agreements for fzs members (which in turn means discounts, for example on GEMA fees).

The fzs has a very lean structure, is supported by voluntary commitment and does not waste vast sums in administration. The benefits and advantages of the fzs far outweigh the membership fee of 0,80€ per year and student. Compared to the costs of studying (rent

and living expenses, over 300,00 € per year in administrative fees alone) this amount seems negligible and will hardly be felt. Political decisions against the interests of students, such as the above-mentioned 1,000.00 € general tuition fees per year, if you do not get BAfÖG because of unfair political regulations or much too little, too short or too late to be able to study meaningfully with it, students get, however, very quickly and strongly negatively felt! The membership fee of the KIT student body to the fzs corresponds in its amount to about four percent of the total budget of the "Verfasste Studierendenschaft". The general meeting decides on the use of membership fees and other income. The largest expenditures of the fzs are in the areas of representation of interests and campaigns as well as educational work and networking.

The student body of KIT - or before that of the University of Karlsruhe (TH) - was already represented in the fzs earlier. It had joined in the fzs founding year 1993 and before that was part of the predecessor organization Vereinigte Deutsche Studentenschaften (VDS). When the Verfasste Studierendenschaft was reintroduced in Baden-Württemberg in 2013, the previous representation (the UStA, the Unabhängige Studierendenausschuss - see https:// www.asta-kit.de/de/studierendenschaft/u-modell) automatically left the fzs. However, the new structures were not directly capable of acting, so there

was no immediate re-entry. Due to the rapid generational changes among the volunteers, the fzs membership was then forgotten for the time being. Since then, the KIT external department has participated in the general meetings of the fzs as a guest without voting rights.

Currently (as of June 10, 2021), 93 student bodies with 946,885 students are represented in the fzs. The fzs is currently growing strongly - in 2018 there were 81 student bodies with 760,237 students. Several more student bodies are currently being admitted.

The federal legislature could also provide for an umbrella organization for students, in which 100% - all students and all student bodies - would come together to represent student interests. The fzs itself is in favor of this. As long as the legislator does not comply with this request, we students have to organize our umbrella organization and our representation of interests ourselves, and that is what we do in the fzs.

CONS

The "freie zusammenschluss von student*innenschaften" (fzs) is a nationwide umbrella organisation of student bodies and is supposed to represent their interests vis-à-vis universities, politics and the public. In practice, the association is often characterised by a lack of transparency, frequent internal disputes

and questionable democratic legitimacy. Currently, the fzs represents just 30% of the students in Germany. Of these hundreds of thousands of students, however, very few are even aware of their indirect membership or the mere existence of the association. This can call into question the representation of all these students.


As an association, the fzs is not politically neutral but left-wing. This is also expressed in its positioning on numerous issues. It is questionable whether it can do justice to its claim to represent all students. For example, the fzs has shown solidarity with squatters several times in the past, considers the banning of the KPD as "delegitimising anti-fascist commitment" and supports anti-fascist associations outside the university.

Thematically, the fzs mainly deals with higher education policy issues such as BAföG, tuition fees or the Bologna reform. However, the fzs also deals with general political issues such as the financial crisis in Greece, the general minimum wage and the situation in Kurdish areas. In the case of issues that do not affect students in a particular way, however, it is questionable whether it is one of the tasks of a student interest group to comment on them. Therefore, this endeavour should not be supported through membership.

Another reason against membership is the fzs' positioning against the Excellence Initiative. KIT places very high value on high-quality research and teaching. As a university of excellence, we not only benefit from a good reputation, KIT can also compete internationally with top universities thanks to funds from the initiative, among other things. The "needs-oriented basic funding" demanded by the fzs instead would be anything but beneficial to the reputation and possibilities of the universities, especially in international comparison. Abolishing the Excellence Initiative would have extreme consequences for KIT. If we want to remain elite students, we must not join the fzs!

80 cents per student per year may look like little money at first glance, but with the amount of students at KIT, it is still more than 18 thousand euros per year that are spent uselessly. The fzs may have some supportable demands in their catalogue, such as the demand for better BAföG, but why we as students in Karlsruhe should have to pay such a lot of money for it is incomprehensible. At the same time, the students of the KIT are already represented at the most important political level for higher education policy, the state, by the state student representation, and that without any expensive membership fees. In addition, it is not clear where these funds go, but a large part of the money goes to delegates who regularly travel to meetings all over the country as conference fees or travel costs (about 6% of the budget).

In addition, almost every political university group also has an association at the federal level. This means that students' interests can also be represented at the national level and even at the European level, and there is no need for another association that in no way represents all students. Through the federal associations of the university groups, the interests and demands of the students end up in the decisions of the parties and also in the Bundestag. This means that there is already a democratic process for the representation of interests and this has no additional costs for the individual student.

Rationalist



Progressive



What do we stand for?

Student bodies should continue to be allowed to express themselves on all topics!

We are an association of many student bodies in order to enable as many different points of view as possible. In addition, we try to bring our experience gained in the faculty committees into the KIT committees. In addition to our multifaceted commitment, we are not afraid of administrative tasks and have been providing at least one member of the student parliament presidium as well as one member of the presidium of the student council conference (FSK) for four years in a row.

Less bureaucracy for student events!

This concern has existed in the student body for a long time. Thanks to our varied work, we have succeeded in establishing a good connection to the service unit of the event management (AServ) in order to be able to mediate especially in problematic cases. Especially in the Corona era, rooms have become an even scarcer commodity. We are committed to ensuring that the opening steps make it possible for student groups to access rooms again.

More study rooms are essential for studying!

Since we often suffer from a shortage of study spaces in normal university life, this is currently an even more important issue. For many students, the library atmosphere is essential for effective learning. That is why we are also intensively campaigning for the expansion of learning space capacity outside of Corona time.

The digitisation of teaching must be actively promoted by KIT!

The experiences of the last 2 years should be used to improve the digitisation of teaching outside of the corona period as a supplement to classroom teaching. We demand that lectures continue to be recorded so that students can better internalise the material. To this end, we are working in close contact with the SCC to promote the expansion of the digital infrastructure on the one hand, and on the other hand with the central offices of the KIT to adapt the newly created regulations in a student-friendly way.

The StuPa should be there for university politics and not for party politics!

In recent years, the StuPa has become very politicised, similar to the general mood in the country. This has led to many problems and even personal insults in some cases. We reject this. The influence and work of the StuPa should benefit the students and not serve to advance party-political ideologies. We want to counter this trend with our mix of new and experienced parliamentarians so that, especially in the current times, we can focus on what is important: the general welfare of our students!

The student body must become climate neutral as soon as possible. We are not only obliged to do this by the climate emergency state declared in 2019, but also by our responsibility towards fellow human beings and future generations. However, we are not content with the student body, but are pushing the process of climate neutralisation at KIT from within it. Important components of a green development at KIT are:

Canteen: Avoidance of greenhouse gas emissions through regional, seasonal and preferably vegetarian/vegan offerings. Reduction of (plastic) waste.

Buildings: Energy-efficient construction and renovation of buildings for teaching, research and living.

Energy: Climate-neutral electricity and heat supply for all KIT campuses and focus on energy efficiency and sufficiency.

Responsible business: Consideration of sustainability in investment decisions, inclusion of lifecycle costs in procurement, movement towards local circular economy and public interest

Environmental and climate protection must no longer be put on the back burner. Our university should not only create knowledge, but also react to it consistently and courageously.

COLORFUL CAMPUS

Green is not enough for us, we do our best for a colorful campus where everyone feels comfortable and valued, regardless of gender, sexual orientation/identity, study programme, origin and disability. We must specifically seek out and tear down existing barriers, racist and ableist structures in order to enable everyone to participate in an equal co-existence on campus.

We consider international exchange in teaching and research to be a great enrichment for our university, which creates new perspectives, ideas and understanding and should be open to all with the lowest possible financial barriers.

In addition to respectful interaction, we believe that a colorful campus also includes a pleasant, functional learning environment where you can and want to sit together with friends between or after classes. The cultural offerings of AKK and university groups are just as indispensable as university sports and the Unifest.

EOUAL OPPORTUNITIES

The fundamental right to education is indispensable to prevent the cementing of existing inequalities in society. It must not be made more difficult or completely denied to financially disadvantaged students by tuition fees, BAföG bureaucracy battles or too little affordable housing.

We also support the student body's solidarity-based hardship fund to ensure that short-term financial bottlenecks do not force any of our fellow students to drop out of their studies.

SUSTAINABLE MOBILITY

The aim is to make sustainable forms of mobility the easiest, most comfortable and safest methods of transport for students and employees at KIT.
